## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING

### TrinityLearning – Easter Experience



In March this year, TrinityLearning (Reg. Charity 1182742) ran one of their largest ever Experience Easter projects with over 500 children from nine different schools taking part online or joining us in Trinity Church.

Experience Easter runs every year in the form of a series of six workshops that share the Easter story and provide opportunities for children to reflect and relate the story to their own experiences. In response to feedback received from our school communities, we run the event as both a 'live' one where children visit us in Trinity Church as well as online, delivered via our website.

Many volunteers from local churches were involved in all aspects of Experience Easter from bead threading and plasticine rolling for each child's small activity pack through to storytelling and supporting the visiting school groups.

We received some great feedback from teaching staff who attended the live Experience Easter:

It's now less than 8 weeks until the Abingdon Passion Play 2024 on 22 June 2024. Rehearsals have been taking place at All Saints Church, St Helen's and St Nicolas' Church. We are all working hard to learn our lines and create the characters we play, in particular, of course, Simon, who is playing Jesus and who appears in almost every scene. The cast members come from many different walks of life, travelling back and forth to and from rehearsals, often after a long day at work, and we have all grown

together over the past few months, particularly over tea and delicious homemade cake during tea break. We are all in awe of the wonderful script, which contains many moving but also some humorous moments, as we see Jesus and his disciples come to life in front of us, and we hope our audience will enjoy the story we are telling as much as the actors are.

### Abingdon Food Bank

Abingdon Food Bank needs your support more than ever now, with the increasing cost of living adversely affecting those already struggling to make ends meet. A typical food parcel might contain: cereal, soup, pasta, rice, tinned tomatoes/pasta sauce, lentils, beans and pulses, tinned meat, tinned vegetables, tea/coffee, tinned fruit, biscuits, UHT milk, fruit juice. Also toiletries, nappies and household cleaning items. Food can be taken to either Preston Road Food Bank or Christ Church Food Bank. Some supermarkets also have collection baskets. Financial donations are also welcome.

TrinityLearning is a tiny, church-funded Abingdon charity that aims to improve wellbeing in Abingdon's school communities. TrinityLearning works with volunteers from across Abingdon's church communities providing a wide range of volunteering opportunities.

We are now looking for volunteers for our Thinking Books project for the 2024-25 school year starting in September. Thinking Books is TrinityLearning's mentoring scheme for primary schools. Our volunteer mentors go into schools regularly to meet children one-to-one or in small groups. They share reading of carefully selected books which start conversations about feelings and relationships. Thinking Books volunteers commit to weekly one-hour sessions in a local primary school. TrinityLearning is committed to Safeguarding.
