prayers. Amen**

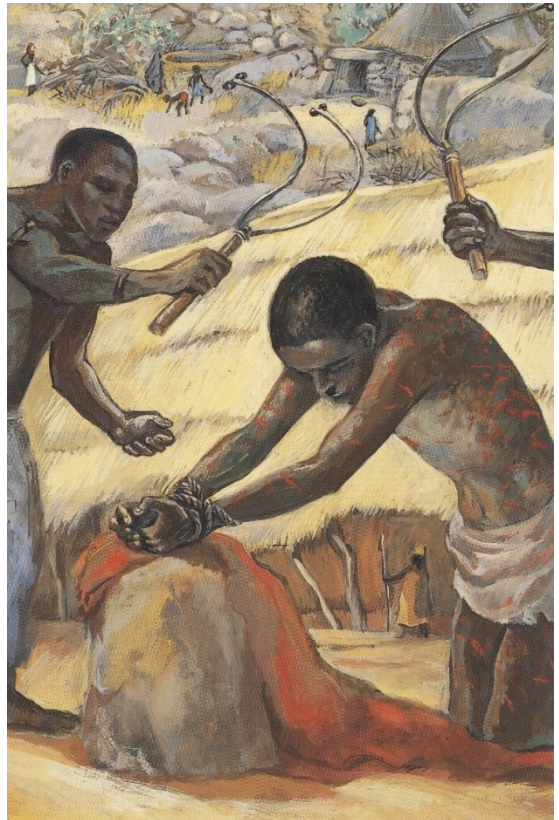


Mothering Sunday - THE CROWN OF THORNS AND PURPLE ROBE

Amen**

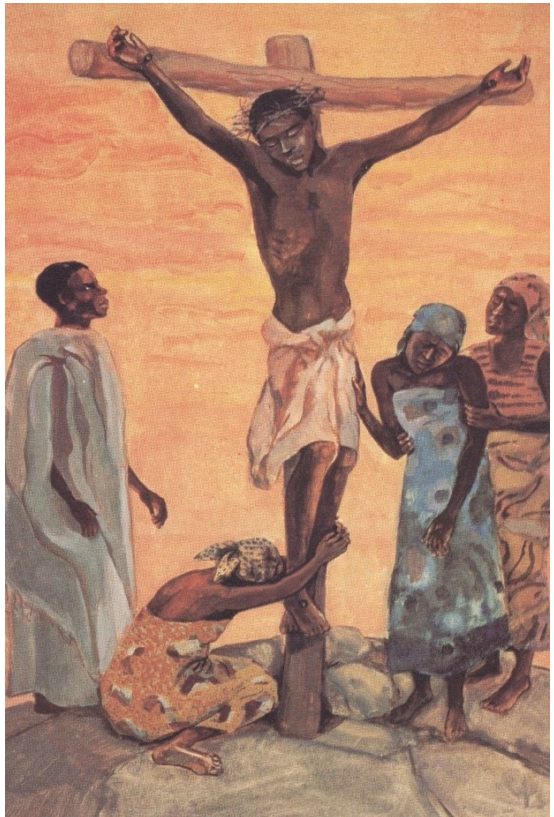


Passion Sunday - THE NAILS
