I decided to knit the second size jumper (size 28) and I bought 5 balls of wool. I have used less than half of the third ball so I should be able to knit two jumpers from the 5 balls. (Though at Masons if you decide on a different size you can be helped with advice on what quantity you may need!)

Although I am not an expert - I knit for fun not precision! - I have kept the pieces separate so that anyone who wishes can see the individual pieces at church this Sunday can see how they may look! It may give an idea of how the pieces are shaped. In any case perhaps we can arrange a get together on one of the Friday coffee mornings or on a Sunday any time after church I am usually around. Please feel free to ask if you have any queries or get stuck at all or just want to know if you've followed the pattern OK! *Eileen*.
