In March, Abingdon Foodbank distributed 229 food parcels to people facing hardship in Abingdon and the surrounding villages. These parcels fed 559 people, of which 243 were children.

I decided to knit the second size jumper (size 28) and I bought 5 balls of wool. I have used less than half of the third ball so I should be able to knit two jumpers from the 5 balls. (Though at Masons if you decide on a different size you can be helped with advice on what quantity you may need!)
