
We received a Birthday Card from our friends at St Michael's and also a card from the Abingdon National Trust, both of which will be on display in the Welcome Area on Sunday.

The proposal for two unitary councils covering Oxfordshire and West Berkshire is a response to an announcement made by the Government in December 2024 which will see two-tier authorities, as seen in Oxfordshire, end and new unitary councils created. Unitary councils provide the same services as county and district councils bringing them together under one roof.

This proposal is being developed by five of the seven current councils covering the area. Together all the councils involved believe this is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to shape and strengthen the future of the public services we provide to our communities. It is the chance to design a new model of local government that delivers high-quality services, improves financial resilience and value for money, and ensures we are able to maintain truly local representation.

Vital to our ambitions, we recognise the importance of local identity and strong engagement with our communities, businesses and local public service providers. We will work closely with those most affected by these changes to hear their thoughts, ideas, and aspirations to shape a future that reflects what's important to them priorities.
